Overview

Southern Command personnel handled 1079 crashes in August 2011. Of these, 750 were property damage, 329 were injury, and 1 was fatal. The total crashes increased by 4.7% compared to last year. When compared to last year, fatalities decreased 83.3%. 31 of these crashes involved commercial vehicles 10 resulted in injuries, 21 were property damage, and 1 resulted in fatalities. Crashes involving commercial vehicles represented 2.8% of the total crashes handled by the Southern Command. Impaired drivers were responsible for 3.6% of all crashes in the Southern Command.
