# **SAFESTAT REPORT**

## **Overview**

In the month of February 2012, we experienced an increase in our overall traffic crashes when compared to the month of January. Northern Command officers handled 296 crashes in the month of February. An overview of the crashes showed 211 were property damage and 81 were classified as injury crashes. There were no reported fatality crashes for our region in February. As compared to February of 2011, our regional commercial vehicle crashes remained the same, at a total of 19. In our overall February 2012 totals, intoxicated drivers were responsible for 20 DUI crashes in the Northern Command.

The officers in our command arrested 114 intoxicated drivers this month. The average blood alcohol level of these intoxicated drivers was .15%, almost twice the legal limit of .08% blood alcohol content. The average age of the intoxicated drivers was 35 years old. Our officers arrested an additional 87 people on various charges over the month of February. In other areas of enforcement, our officers wrote 3,119 speeding citations, 1,432 hazardous moving citations and 557 seat belt citations.
