Overview

Southern Command personnel handled 1148 crashes in March 2012. Of these, 809 were property damage, 337 were injury, and 2 were fatal. The total crashes increased by 8.9% compared to last year. When compared to last year, fatalities decreased 33.3%. 22 of these crashes involved commercial vehicles 5 resulted in injuries, 17 were property damage, and 0 resulted in fatalities. Crashes involving commercial vehicles represented 1.9% of the total crashes handled by the Southern Command. Impaired drivers were responsible for 4.5% of all crashes in the Southern Command.

The Southern Command is driven to provide this community with a professional and effective law enforcement presence. The Southern Command extends a thank you to all those who assisted us in gaining success in our law enforcement services this past month.
