Overview

Southern Command personnel handled 1034 crashes in May 2012. Of these, 740 were property damage, 288 were injury, and 6 were fatal. The total crashes decreased by 1.6% compared to last year. When compared to last year, fatalities decreased 0.0%. 36 of these crashes involved commercial vehicles 8 resulted in injuries, 28 were property damage, and 0 resulted in fatality. Crashes involving commercial vehicles represented 3.4% of the total crashes handled by the Southern Command. Impaired drivers were responsible for 2.8% of all crashes in the Southern Command.
