Overview

Southern Command personnel handled 1045 crashes in July 2012. Of these, 751 were property damage, 288 were injury, and 6 were fatal. The total crashes decreased by 3.3% compared to last year. When compared to last year, fatalities increased 50%. 40 of these crashes involved commercial vehicles 6 resulted in injuries, 34 were property damage, and 0 resulted in fatality. Crashes involving commercial vehicles represented 3.8% of the total crashes handled by the Southern Command. Impaired drivers were responsible for 2% of all crashes in the Southern Command.

The Southern Command is driven to provide this community with a professional and effective law enforcement presence. The Southern Command extends a thank you to all those who assisted us in gaining success in our law enforcement services this past month.
