SAFESTAT REPORT

Overview

There were 75 crashes that occurred in August 2012. This is a 12.8% decrease from August 2011, and an increase of 1.4% from last month. Property crashes decreased by 29.7% compared to August 2011. Injury crashes increase by 14.3% as compared to August 2011. Northern Command East troopers investigated six fatal crashes during August 2012. These crashes resulted in the death of seven persons, of which two were unrestrained. The six fatal investigations were an increase of 500% over August 2011 and a 200% increase over July 2012. There was two crashes involving an impaired driver, which is a 66.7% decrease from August 2011 and 100% increase from last month. Of the 75 accidents, 21 or 28% involved commercial motor vehicles. Commercial drivers were found to be at fault in 13 or 61.9%, of these accidents. 11 of the commercial vehicle accidents occurred on Interstate 80.

Total enforcement activity for August 2012 was 2327 cited violations. This was a decrease of 23 violations or 1% as compared to July 2012. Compared to August of 2011, the command showed an increase of 240 violations or 11.5%. Speed violations decreased by 212 or 16.4%, as compared to July 2012 and decreased 6.2% compared to August 2011. Hazardous moving violations remain unchanged from the prior month and decreased 4.1%, compared to August 2011. Occupant restraint violations increased by 6.3% compared to July 2012; and they increased by 91.8% compared to August 2011. There were 14 arrests of impaired drivers made in August 2012, with two of those arrests coming from crashes. The total arrests for August 2012 showed a 32.1% decrease of persons arrested compared to July 2012 and a 45.7% decrease compared to August 2011.

Commercial vehicle inspections decreased by 7.5% or 51 inspections as compared to July 2012. There were 68 fewer safety violations written in August 2012 than in July 2012. Commercial operations showed 21 fewer citations issued, compared to July 2012 and a decrease of 23 citations or 35.9% compared to August 2011. Officers placed 18 vehicles and 13 drivers, "Out of Service", in August 2012. Vehicles placed out of service decreased by one or 5.3% and drivers placed "Out of Service" decreased by four or 23.5% compared to July 2012. Vehicles placed out of service fell by 30.8% and drivers placed out of service decreased by 7.1% compared to August 2011. Traffic personnel conducted 304 commercial inspections during August 2012 and issued 88 safety violation citations and 161 safety repair order violations. Additionally, six drivers and 11 vehicles were placed out of service by traffic personnel during this reporting period.

Front office staff processed 15 less accident reports for a decrease of 17.3% compared to July 2012. Arrest reports processed increased by 2 or 5% compared to July 2012. Processed incident reports decreased by two compared to July 2012. The Communications Center radio transmissions increased by 7.1% compared to July 2012. Computer Aided Dispatch incidents also increased by 1.26%. The Center received 7011 telephone calls for the month of August. Because recording equipment was down for a potion of July no comparison can be made.

Warrant office staff saw decreases in warrants received and entered compared to July 2012. Warrants validated and cleared also decreased compared to July 2012. Extraditions and transports increased compared to last month.

Total wage costs for personnel assigned to contract services were increased from \$66,947.42 in August 2011 to \$83,127.96 in August 2012.
