# **SAFESTAT REPORT**

## **Overview**

This month Northern Command West hosted a visit from the 1<sup>st</sup> lady, the Vice President, and the Republican Presidential Candidate. We utilized additional staff on these events and worked in conjunction with the Washoe County Sheriff's Office, Reno Police Department, and Sparks Police Department.

In continued support of the Strategic Highway Safety Plan, all commanders in both the Northern Command West and East participated in committees in the five critical emphasis areas: impaired driving, seatbelts, pedestrians, lane departures, and intersections.

One Northern Command West sergeant and two Northern Command West officers dedicated 188 hours toward completing background investigations for officer applicants. Our staff also dedicated 645.75 hours to training at the DPS Academy, 50 hours of training to Capitol Police, and 30 hours of training to P.O.S.T.

This month we experienced a 2.2% increase in our overall traffic crashes when compared to the month of September. Northern Command West officers handled 329 crashes in October. An overview of the crashes showed 218 were property damage, 110 were classified as injury crashes, and one was classified as a fatal crash. As compared to October of 2011, we experienced a 55.6% increase in our regional commercial vehicle crashes at 14 for the month. In our overall October 2012 totals, intoxicated drivers were responsible for 10 crashes in the Northern Command West.

The officers in our command arrested 75 intoxicated drivers this month. The average blood alcohol level of those intoxicated drivers was 0.16%, twice the legal limit of 0.08% blood alcohol content. The average age of the intoxicated driver was 38 years old. Our officers arrested an additional 402 people on various charges over the month of October. In other areas of enforcement, our officers wrote 2,264 speed citations, 979 hazardous moving citations, and 293 seatbelt citations.
