SAFESTAT REPORT

Overview

There were 56 crashes that occurred in November 2012. This is a 46.7% decrease from November 2011, and a decrease of 15.2% from last month. Property crashes decreased by 34.8% compared to November 2011. Injury crashes decreased by 66.7% as compared to November 2011. There were no fatal crashes occurring this month or last month. This is a decrease of 300% as compared to last November 2011.There were no crashes involving impaired drivers, which is a 100% decrease from November 2011 and a 300% decrease as compared to October 2012. Of the 66 accidents, 11 or 19.6% involved commercial motor vehicles. Commercial drivers were found to be at fault in 6 or 54.5%, of these accidents. Five of the commercial vehicle accidents occurred on Interstate 80.

Total enforcement activity for November 2012 was 1953 cited violations. This was a decrease of 69 violations or 3.4% as compared to October 2012. Compared to November 2011, the Command showed a decrease of 335 violations or 14.6%. Speed violations increased by 59 or 6.5%, as compared to October 2012 and decreased 22.3% compared to November 2011. Hazardous moving violations decreased 29.9% from the prior month and decreased 8.9%, compared to November 2011. Occupant restraint violations decreased 12% compared to October 2012 and decreased by 42.7% as compared to November 2011. There were 13 arrests of impaired drivers made in November 2012, with none of those arrests coming from crashes. The total arrests for November 2012 showed a 14.6% decrease of persons arrested compared to October 2012 and a 13.9% increase compared to November 2011.

Commercial vehicle inspections increased by 20% or 97 inspections as compared to October 2012. There were 37 more safety violations written in November 2012 than in October 2012. Commercial operations showed 14 more citations issued, compared to October 2012 and a decrease of 25 citations or 42.4% compared to November 2011. Officers placed 16 vehicles and 13 drivers, "Out of Service", in November 2012. Vehicles placed out of service increased by 7 or 77.8% and drivers placed "Out of Service" increased by 6 or 85.7% compared to October 2012. Vehicles placed out of service fell by 5.9% and drivers placed out of service decreased by 23.5% compared to November 2011. Traffic personnel conducted 212 commercial inspections during November 2012 and issued 41 safety violation citations and 138 safety repair order violations. This is a decrease of 27 inspections from the previous year. Additionally, three drivers and three vehicles were placed out of service by traffic personnel during this reporting period.

Front office staff processed 8 more accident reports for an increase of 14.29% compared to October 2012. Arrest reports processed decreased by 6 or 13.33% compared to October 2012. Processed incident reports increased by 9 compared to October 2012. The Communications Center radio transmissions increased by 3.33% compared to October 2012. Computer Aided Dispatch incidents increased by 4.01%. The Center received 5275 telephone calls for the month of November. This is a 12.46% decrease when compared to October 2012.

Warrant office staff saw a decrease in warrants received and warrants entered remained the same as compared to October 2012. Warrants cleared also decreased compared to October 2012, however warrants validated increased. Extraditions and transports decreased compared to last month.

Total costs collected for contract services were increased from \$38,038.04 in November 2011 to \$71,872.28 in November 2012.
