SAFESTAT REPORT

Overview

There were 110 crashes that occurred in January 2013. This is a 10.6% decrease from last month and a 48.6% increase from last year. This is primarily due to a winter storm that struck northern Nevada with heavy freezing rain. Property crashes increased by 71.7% compared to January 2012. Injury crashes remained the same as compared to January 2012. There were no fatal crashes occurring this month, a 300% decrease as compared to January 2012 and a 100% decrease from last month. There were 2 crashes involving impaired drivers, which is a 200% increase from January 2013 and a 50% decrease as compared to December 2012. Of the 110 accidents, 37 or 33.6% involved commercial motor vehicles. Commercial drivers were found to be at fault in 27 or 75%, of these accidents. 27 of the commercial vehicle accidents occurred on Interstate 80.

Total enforcement activity for January 2013 was 2,189 cited violations. This was an increase of 231 violations or 11.8% as compared to December 2012. Compared to January 2012, the Command showed an increase of 440 violations or 25.2%. Speed violations increased by 2 or .3%, as compared to December 2012 and 1.1% compared to January 2012. Hazardous moving violations increased 5.5% from the prior month and increased 81.1%, compared to January 2012. Occupant restraint violations increased 47.7% compared to December 2012 and increased by 174.6% as compared to January 2012. There were 16 arrests of impaired drivers made in January 2013. The total arrests for January 2013 showed no change in the number of persons arrested compared to December 2012 and a 40% increase compared to January 2012.

Commercial vehicle inspections decreased by 22.1% or 144 inspections as compared to December 2012. There were 75 fewer safety violations written in January 2013 than in December 2012. Commercial operations showed a decrease of 13 citations issued, compared to December 2012 and a decrease of 30 citations or 56.6% compared to January 2012. Officers placed 12 vehicles and 9 drivers, "Out of Service", in January 2013. Vehicles placed out of service decreased by 6 or 33.3% and drivers placed "Out of Service" decreased by 13 or 59.1% compared to December 2012. Vehicles placed out of service fell by 45.5% and drivers placed out of service fell by 52.6% as compared to January 2012. Traffic personnel conducted 307 commercial inspections during January 2013 and issued 54 safety violation citations and 162 safety repair order violations. This is an increase of 89 inspections from the previous year. Additionally, seven drivers and nine vehicles were placed out of service by traffic personnel during this reporting period.

Front office staff processed a total of 117 accident reports this is an increase of 25.8% as compared to December 2012. Arrest reports processed increased by 14 or 25.4% compared to December 2012. Processed incident reports decreased by one compared to December 2012. The Communications Center radio transmissions increased by 12.4% compared to December 2012. Computer Aided Dispatch incidents increased by 10.7%. The Center received 6,414 telephone calls for the month of January. This is a 7.6% increase when compared to December 2012.

Warrant office staff saw a decrease in warrants received and an increase of warrants entered as compared to December 2012. Warrants cleared and validated increased compared to December 2012. Extraditions and transports decreased as compared to last month.

Total costs collected for contract services were increased from \$42,031.49 in January 2012 to \$48,721.49 in January 2013.
