Overview

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Southern Command personnel handled 1111 crashes in March 2013. Of these, 774 were property damage, 330 were injury, and 13 were fatal. The total crashes decreased by 3.2% compared to last year. When compared to last year, fatalities increased 250.0%. 59 of these crashes involved commercial vehicles; 28 of the commercial crashes resulted in injuries, 30 were property damage, and 1 resulted in fatality. Crashes involving commercial vehicles represented 5.3% of the total crashes handled by the Southern Command. Impaired drivers were responsible for 2.8 % of all crashes in the Southern Command.
